A conversation between our Artistic Directors

Kodie Rollan, Chromatic Theatre and Bronwyn Steinberg Lunchbox Theatre





KODIE: Hello and maligayang pagdating (welcome) to our production of *Kisapmata* by Bianca Miranda! We at Chromatic Theatre are so excited that we finally get to share this incredible story in partnership with the fine folks at Lunchbox Theatre! It feels like a long time coming eh Bronwyn?

BRONWYN: Well these things do take a while, but I think it was "love at first read" for all of us when Chromatic first presented this piece as part of the IBPOC Playwrights Unit back in 2021. I knew right away that I loved Bianca's writing and that I'd love to see *Kisapmata* at Lunchbox. We were delighted to support Bianca's process developing the play at our Stage One and

Stage Two Festivals of New Canadian Work in 2022. And now, we couldn't ask for better partners than you and Chromatic to join us to finally premiere this story in a full production!

KODIE: And with all the food mentioned in the show, Lunchbox feels like the PERFECT partner for this show! As an immigrant from the Philippines myself, it felt really important to share a story surrounding my community as the first piece that I program for Chromatic Theatre, as a new Artistic Director. Statistically speaking, Filipinos are the third largest subset of immigrants here in Turtle Island.

BRONWYN: Yes, and we're so excited about this opportunity to specifically welcome Filipino audiences to the theatre with this story. But of course a story about Filipino characters in Canada is also an absolutely Canadian story! I think audience members from all communities can relate to these characters' experiences.

KODIE: I absolutely agree, Bronwyn! And what excited us about Bianca's story is in the way that she's able to craft such a rich world that truly embodies the beautiful richness of Filipino culture and the realities of a diasporic community, all through the vehicle of a romance story! Brought to life by such a talented artistic team, we just know that you'll leave the show feeling *kilig* to the max!

BRONWYN: I've heard that word, *kilig*, mentioned a lot in the process but what does that actually mean?

KODIE: *Kilig* is a Tagalog word that describes that feeling of romantic excitement! It's the butterflies in your stomach feeling, that "so excited when your crush texts you that you could squeal" feeling!

BRONWYN: That totally makes sense and is so perfect for the romantic vibe that *Kisapmata* has! And even more perfect that we get to savour this love story around Valentine's Day!

KODIE: It truly feels like the show embodies a bunch of different love letters—it's a love letter to oneself and one's identity, to a romantic partner, but also it's a love letter to the culture!

BRONWYN: So thank you for coming in out of the February cold to -

KODIE: Cozy up like you're watching your fave rom com or teleserye and -

BRONWYN: Enjoy the show! Thank you!

KODIE: And maraming maraming salamat!

Playwright's Notes — Bianca Miranda



Growing up in the Philippines, my mama, lola, and I would gather in the living room every night to watch episodes of our favourite teleseryes. These teleseryes brought us together - the stories were simple, at times predictable, but we were invested. 'Yelling at the TV like they could hear us' kind of invested.

So I wanted to write something like that. But make it queer, of course!

This play is a lot of things for me: the first play I've written by myself. A loud and proud declaration of all things Filipino - the language, the food, the music, the culture, our hopes and dreams, and the way we love. A loud and proud declaration of being here

and queer.

10 years ago, I visited the Philippines for the first time since moving here. One conversation with a friend stood out to me. She had just broken up with her girlfriend of 10 years and I asked if her parents ever knew about them. She said, "Yes, they knew. I'm still young now. Our deal is that I would marry a guy and give them grandchildren one day." I remember being enraged. I wanted to tell her, "You don't have to just take that. You deserve better. You have to fight." But even with all that rage, I understood. There was an acceptance in her body. I recognized it because I've been there before.

It is a great privilege to be able to write this love story. I've known A and B for quite some time. They're parts of me. They're recollections of all the loves I've had in my life.

This story is my whole heart.

I hope you lean into the 'corny', that you allow yourself to experience the 'kilig', and that you feel the undeniable love that these two people shared.

Maraming salamat sa pagtangkilik ng talentong Pilipino.

Thank you for being here.

Through intimate vignettes, we see the longing, the diving in, and eventually, the letting go.

Director's Notes — Gina Puntil



I have the privilege to have been a part of *Kisapmata* with Bianca and Chromatic Theatre since the first virtual workshop in 2021. From that moment I WAS HOOKED - what a gift of a script! I wanted to support the further development of it with all my available resources. However, I did pause and to ask myself if I was the one to direct a play about young queer Filipinx/a love. I ask because this wasn't my journey, I am the age of the moms of the characters in this play, and I am not fluent in Tagalog. What started as a list of questions turned out to be the base of values of directing the show.

This play is about love, and I truly believe that love is love is love. (Ay corny!) This play is about looking back and remembering

connections that are close to your heart. Connections that informed choices in your life that has guided you and shaped you into the person you are.

This play is about sharing a cultural identity in a diasporic world. A quote from Tasneem Hameed that I have held onto as I was directing is "learn character from trees, values from roots, and change from leaves."

This play is about being enough. Specifically for me, being "Filipino enough". I am not fluent in any of languages of the Philippines, I don't karaoke, I was born here in Calgary because my parents came here for broader opportunities (of which I will be forever grateful), I am not a nurse, teacher, or engineer, and I am a Filipino. However you walk through the world applying your whole self, you are enough.

From the first virtual workshop, through Lunchbox's Stage One and Stage Two Festivals, to the moment of the lights going down in the theatre, this journey has been firmly supported and gently held with laughter, tears, challenging questions, and discoveries. I need to give thanks to our As and Bs along the way. To Chariz Faulmino, Kathleen Ballangan, and Nicole Reyes you are all intertwined in the breath of the story.

Thanks for coming. I truly hope you enjoy the show.


Kathryn Smith - Lighting Designer

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


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
