Lunchbox Theatre brings to life the multidisciplinary storytelling show about living and working with guide dogs, *Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia.* Tickets on sale now.

CALGARY, AB – January 11, 2023 — Lunchbox Theatre kicks off 2023 with a new play that is sure to warm your heart, *Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia*. Created by Kim Kilpatrick, Karen Bailey and Artistic Director Bronwyn Steinberg, this play is a co-presentation with <u>Inside Out Theatre</u> and is presented as a part of the <u>High Performance Rodeo</u>. The play features storyteller Kim Kilpatrick, visual artist Karen Bailey, as well as Kim's guide dog, Ginger! The show will be live and in-person in the Studio Theatre at Vertigo. This production will preview on February 1 and run until February 19, 2023. The official opening show is on February 2.

Kim Kilpatrick (Storyteller)

Kim Kilpatrick is a storyteller, former Paralympian and disability rights activist who has handled five guide dogs. As a woman who was born blind, she brings a fresh and unique approach to the art of storytelling. Kim has over twenty years of experience as a storyteller and has performed on the NAC fourth stage, at storytelling and theatre festivals across Canada since 2004.

She has two additional one-woman shows *"Flying in the Dark"* (2010) and *"Dangerous Touch"* (2022). She also performs regularly in schools and for seniors groups.

Kim is known for autobiographical material—humorous, entertaining, and engaging stories about living as a person who is blind, as well as folk and epic tales and historical material. Kim regularly performs with MASC (Multicultural Arts Schools Communities).

Synopsis:

A multidisciplinary storytelling show about living and working with guide dogs. Blind storyteller and disability rights activist Kim Kilpatrick tells charming, insightful and surprising stories about Tulia and her other canine companions alongside acclaimed visual artist Karen Bailey's beautiful paintings of Stanley, a guide dog puppy she raised. This collaboration documents the journey from puppy to working guide dog for the blind, incorporating storytelling, painting, video, audio description and music. And yes, Kim's dog Ginger will be onstage!

Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia will be performed by Kim Kilpatrick (storyteller) and Ginger (guide dog).

The creative team for *Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia* includes Bronwyn Steinberg (director), Carissa Sams (Stage Manager), Michael Luong (Apprentice Stage Manager). Visual art by Karen Bailey, Sound Design and Composition by Angela Schleihauf and Visual Effects by Trudy Wohlleben.

PLEASE NOTE:

In order to protect our performer (who is immunocompromised) and to provide options within the audience environment for all our patrons, audience members are requested to wear a mask if they would like to sit in the front two rows of the theatre. Masking is strongly encouraged for all performances, but it is not mandated in an effort to keep Kim as healthy as possible. If you have purchased tickets and are feeling unwell the day of your performance we will gladly exchange them for another date for you!

The masked performances for *Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia* will be at 12 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 7 and Tuesday, Feb. 14.

Lunchbox is partnering again with Inside Out Theatre with their <u>Good Host program</u> to provide a Relaxed and ASL performance of *Raising Stanley/Life with Tulia* on Sunday, Feb. 5 at 12 p.m..

A relaxed environment is a great way to introduce kids to theatre without the classic theatre etiquette, allowing for more wiggling and giggling. We suggest this show for 12+ but if you have a child younger than that, then this performance is an option for families.

Open audio description is integrated into the production, so all performances are accessible for blind and visually impaired audience members.

Note: All reviewers need to book tickets for the 1st week of the run. No exceptions.
